**March Monthly Actions: Agency Took Licensure Action against Five Providers, Five Additional Providers Terminated from the Medicaid Program**

**Tallahassee, Fla.**—The Agency for Health Care Administration (Agency) issued final orders to five providers for failure to meet licensure requirements during the month of March. The Agency issued two final orders to deny a license renewal application, one to revoke an existing license and two that resulted in the provider surrendering the license. An emergency moratorium on admissions was issued for Autumn Home Care ahead of the home health agency surrendering its license. Some of these providers were enrolled in the Medicaid program; however, the Agency has terminated or is in the process of terminating their participation in the program.

“The Agency continues to take action against providers who do not adhere to rules and policies,” said Secretary Liz Dudek. “We have a duty and we are committed to removing them from the Medicaid program and assuring they are not licensed by the Agency. By taking these actions, we can better ensure quality health care for all Floridians.”

Five additional providers were issued final orders terminating them from participation in the Medicaid program in March. These terminations resulted from sanctions imposed for reasons including termination from the Medicaid or Medicare program and guilty of conspiracy to commit health care fraud. These providers also have been reported to the federal government for placement on the federal exclusion list, which prohibits them from participating in Medicaid and Medicare nationwide.
