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May Monthly Actions: Agency Took Licensure Action against Ten Providers

Tallahassee, Fla. – The Agency for Health Care Administration (Agency) issued final orders to eight providers for failure to meet licensure requirements during the month of May.

There were five final orders to revoke an existing license, one final order to deny a license renewal application, one final order to suspend a license and one that resulted in the provider surrendering their license. Some of these providers were enrolled in the Medicaid program and the Agency has terminated or is in the process of terminating their participation in the program.

As well as the final order actions, the Agency also issued two Emergency Suspension Orders to Los Tinajones- Home Care, Inc., an assisted living facility in Miami-Dade county and OEMA, Inc. d/b/a Better Care Home, an assisted living facility in Miami-Dade county.
