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February Monthly Actions: Agency Took Licensure Action against Four Providers, 16 Additional Providers Suspended or Terminated from the Medicaid Program

Tallahassee, Fla. – The Agency for Health Care Administration (Agency) issued one final order to deny a license renewal during the month of February. The Agency also issued an Emergency Suspension Order to Karnella G. Johnson, an adult family care home in Polk County; an Emergency Suspension Order to United Senior Living, Inc., an assisted living facility in Miami-Dade County; and an Immediate Moratorium on Admissions to Advanced ALF Corp., an assisted living facility in Miami-Dade County.

In addition, 12 providers were issued final orders terminating them from participation in the Medicaid program and have been reported to the federal government for placement on the federal exclusion list, which prohibits them from participating in Medicaid and Medicare nationwide. The Agency also suspended four providers from participation in the Medicaid program, prohibiting the providers from being paid for claims to the Medicaid program for furnishing, supervising a person who is furnishing, or causing a person to furnish goods or services.

Agency Medicaid terminations and suspensions typically result from failure to return funds due to the Agency within required timeframes; a charge, indictment, or guilty plea to a health care related crime; suspension, termination, or exclusion from Medicare or Medicaid in another state; or a license denial, revocation, suspension or termination by the licensing agency.
