Opening Remarks Brittany Gray

Brittany Gray welcomed everyone to the meeting/webinar. She provided an overview of the virtual meeting logistics, advising that all attendee lines would be muted, and attendees would need to use the hand raise feature to be acknowledged before speaking.

Medicaid Program Updates

Tom Wallace



Agency for Health Care Administration Division of Medicaid Meeting Summary

Tom Wallace, the Deputy Secretary for Medicaid, provided updates for the Medicaid Program. Mr. Wallace provided an overview on management staffing changes, welcoming Mr. Ross Nobles as the new Chief of Medicaid Program Finance, and Ms. Joycee Barry as the Chief of Medicaid Data Analytics. Mr. Wallace then announced the total enrollment for Medicaid as of November 11, 2022, as 5.54 million recipients. This represents an increase of 1.9% percent over the past 3 months. He indicated that the population that has increased the most has been children and families (TANF).

Mr. Wallace provided an update on the Public Health Emergency (PHE), stating that in October, the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) extended the PHE until January 11. Mr. Wallace stated that HHS Secretary, Xavier Becerra, has promised to give stakeholders 60-days' notice before lifting the declaration. Mr. Wallace advised that because HHS did not provide a 60-day notice in time to lift the declaration on January 11, it is understood that the PHE will once again be renewed, effective January 11, 2023, and will run for 90 days.

Mr. Wallace then provided an update on the Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) funding opportunity, reminding attendees that the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) went into effect April 1, 2021. Mr. Wallace stated that Section 9817 of this Act authorized an increased Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP) to support HCBS. He stated that there are four one-time funding opportunities currently available: Provider Stipend Payments, Provider Retention Payments, Delayed Egress, and 1099 Provider Retention Payments. Mr. Wallace then provided updated statistics on payments that have been processed as of 9/23/22.

Mr. Wallace then announced that the Statewide Medicaid Managed Care (SMMC) Data Book was released November and accessed through following today, 22, 2022. can be the https://ahca.mvflorida.com/Medicaid/statewide mc/smmc re-procure.shtml. He also indicated that the Agency is hosting a public meeting to address questions about the Data Book on Thursday, January 5, 2023. Mrs. Gray provided an update on Subcommittee Appointments, stating that appointments had been made and letters would be mailed out to those members soon.

Mrs. Gray then indicated that the MCAC would be asked to provide feedback on the Comprehensive Quality Strategy Report. This is a written quality strategy for assessing and improving the quality of health care and services furnished by the managed care organizations and other

providers. It outlines Florida Medicaid's priorities and goals for: continuous quality improvement, performance improvement efforts that align with and promote these priorities/goals, and quality metrics & performance targets used in measuring performance & improvements. Mrs. Gray advised that the MCAC review is anticipated for Spring of 2023, and that the current report from December 2020 is available through the following link:
