## **Limited Early Construction Request**

Construction of the project cannot commence until final construction documents have been reviewed and approved by the Office of Plans and Construction. Approval to begin foundation, site work, structural frame, and/or demolition work only may be approved prior to final construction document approval if the following items are submitted:

- A stage II preliminary approval letter from the Office of Plans and Construction.
- A hold harmless letter from the facility or provider stating that the facility will not hold the Agency responsible for any changes to the foundation, site work and/or demolition work as a result of the final construction document review.
- Signed, sealed and dated plans depicting **only** the work submitted for consideration of early construction approval.

## A request to begin demolition work also requires the following:

- An infection control risk assessment (ICRA) completed by the multidiscipline project infection control team signed by the facility's infection control officer.
- Clear depiction of all construction barriers, air pressure relationships, and other infection control elements prescribes by the ICRA.

## A request to begin construction work on a new hospital or nursing home building or an addition to an existing hospital or nursing home also requires the following:

• Evidence of compliance with the flood resistance requirements of the Florida Building Code (See FBC-B Sections 449.4 and 450.4)

For a project involving a new nursing home or a bed addition to an existing nursing home a certificate of need (CON) is required. The inclusion of a copy of the CON certificate and any modifications or extensions (if applicable) will aide in the timely review of this request.
