The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) approves the Planning Advance Planning Document-Update (PAPD-U) submitted by the Florida Agency for Health Care Administration (AHCA) on November 21, 2014, and in revised form on December 3 and 8, 2014. Florida submitted the PAPD-U to update the schedule, budget, proposed contracts, and list of deliverables for the state's project to replace or enhance the Medicaid Management Information System (MMIS) and Decision Support System (DSS), and to obtain a new fiscal agent.

On February 5, 2014, CMS approved Florida's PAPD requesting federal funding for planning activities pertinent to replacement or enhancement of the state's MMIS by June 30, 2018, as well as preparations to procure a new fiscal agent once the state's current contract with Hewlett Packard Enterprise Services (HPES) expires on June 30, 2018. By that date, Florida will have used HPES's interChange MMIS for ten years. As requested in the PAPD, CMS approved \$16,781,529 for project activities through federal fiscal year (FFY) 2018, with federal financial participation (FFP) in the amount of \$15,115,762.

In the PAPD-U, Florida requests additional funding to expand the scopes of work for the Project Management Office/Design, Development, and Implementation (PMO/DDI) contractor and the Independent Verification and Validation (IV&V) contractor to include robust user acceptance testing, organizational change management, fiscal agent compliance and traceability monitoring, and Implementation Advance Planning Document (IAPD) development. Additionally, Florida adds to the MMIS replacement project a new contracted staffing approach to support limited state resources. Finally, the PAPD-U removes the planned Implementation and Testing contractor, as these activities will now be addressed by the PMO and IV&V contractors.

Florida's PAPD-U for the state's MMIS replacement project is approved by CMS in accordance with Section 1903(a)(3) of the Social Security Act, as well as 42 CFR § 433, subpart C, 45 CFR § 95, subpart F, and Part 11 of the State Medicaid Manual (SMM). As requested in the PAPD-U, CMS approves an additional \$11,707,877 (\$10,435,131 in FFP), resulting in a total project budget of \$28,489,407, with FFP of \$25,539,761. Funding authorization has been extended through September 30, 2019.

The amounts allocated in Appendix A cannot be reallocated between federal fiscal years, even within the period of this letter's approval, without submission and approval of another APD-U. This approval letter supersedes the previous PAPD approval letter issued by CMS for Florida's MMIS replacement project.

Florida is reminded that onsite reviews will be conducted to determine whether or not the objectives for which FFP was approved are being accomplished, and whether or not the automatic data processing (ADP) equipment or services are being efficiently and effectively utilized in support of approved programs or projects as provided for at 45 CFR Part 95 § 621 and the SMM. As provided by the SMM, Section 11200 and by 45 CFR § 95.611, all subsequent revisions and amendments to the PAPD-U will require CMS prior written approval to qualify for FFP. In accordance with 45 CFR § 95.623, state acquisition of ADP equipment and services without prior approval could result in disallowance of FFP.

Any changes to previously approved contracts for this effort require CMS prior approval pursuant to 45 CFR § 95.611. Allowable costs are determined by 42 CFR § 433.116, 45 CFR § 92, 45 CFR § 95, subpart F, and the SMM, Part 11. Only actual costs incurred are reimbursable. The state must provide adequate support for all costs claimed in addition to providing detailed records and proper audit trails.
