



Adult Protective Services Recommended Guidelines



Purpose: To recommend guidelines for residents when Sexual Offenders/Predators reside in long-term care facilities in Florida.

Sexual Offenders or Predators residing in long-term care facilities in Florida.

2. Description of Recommended Guideline (Provide detailed information of the recommended guideline)

- Adult Protective Services staff will notify the administrator of the long-term care facility when an
 individual for which the Department seeks placement is listed on the Florida Department of Law
 Enforcement (FDLE) Sexual Offenders/Predators public registry. The notification will be made prior to
 the facility receiving the Sexual Offender/Predator for admission.
- 2. The long-term care facility may utilize the FDLE Sexual Offenders/Predators public registry as a routine screening mechanism for facility admissions.
- 3. The long-term care facility must develop an appropriate and individualized care plan for any known Sex Offender/Predator residing in the facility in accordance with current state and federal regulations.

3. Resources Needed to Implement the Recommended Guidelines (Identify human and material resources needed)

- Adult Protective Services staff for screening potential placements through the FDLE database.
- 2. Appropriate long-term care staff for the development of the Sexual Offender/Predator's individualized care plan.
- 3. Resident, resident's family, and other legal representatives for participation in the development of the care plan to the extent they are capable and available.
- 4. Internet Access for FDLE Sexual Offenders/Predators public registry screening.

4. Other Comments (Provide any additional comments regarding the recommended guidelines)

- 1. The Agency for Healthcare Administration will post on its website the "guidelines" recommended for Sexual Offenders/Predators residing in long-term care facilities in Florida.
- 2. Nursing homes are required by federal and state regulations to provide for residents' rights and their safety.
- 3. Assisted living facilities are required by state regulations to provide for residents' rights and their safety.
