## **IMPORTANT NOTICE**

Applicants Applying for:

<sup>1</sup>Assisted Living Facilities - <sup>2</sup>Adult Family Care Homes - <sup>3</sup>Adult Day Care Centers - <sup>4</sup>Hospice Residential Unit

If you are planning to apply for a license for one of the above four name facilities and your home or facility will serve food and/or have a well, pool, or septic system, contact your local County Health Department (CHD) immediately. ## Food Hygiene

All residences and facilities are required to **submit a complete floor plan and proposed menu** to the local County Health Department (CHD), prior to <u>construction</u>, <u>renovation</u>, <u>change of ownership</u>, <u>change of maximum</u> <u>occupancy</u> or <u>opening</u>. This is to assure that the kitchen and dining areas have required equipment and meet Chapters 64E-11 or applicable food sections of 64E-12, FAC. This floor plan shall be drawn to scale and accurately detail the food service and preparation areas, including a list of food equipment to be used. It shall also include all outbuildings, fencing, restrooms, septic system, wells, etc. Fees may be associated with this plan review and permitting process.

Food Hygiene standards shall be met prior to issuing a license, renovation, a change of ownership, change of maximum occupancy, or opening for business. Assisted Living Facility	64E-11, FAC, for facilities licensed for 11 or more residents. Application and permit required. 64E-12.004, FAC, for those licensed for 10 or fewer residents.
Adult Family Care Homes	64E-12.004, FAC.
Adult Day Care	64E-11, FAC. Application and permit required.
Hospice Residential Unit	64E-11, FAC. Application and permit required.

## Physical Plant Sanitation or Group Care Inspection

In addition to the food hygiene requirements assisted living facilities, hospice, and adult family care homes must meet physical plant sanitation standards outlined in Chapter 64E-12 FAC, for Community Based Residential Facilities. Chapter 64E-12, FAC, does not apply to adult day care centers, as they are not residential facilities. ## Well, Pool or Septic System

If your facility/home has a well, pool or septic system on the property to be used for any of the facilities listed at the top of this notice, you must also contact the local County Health Department (CHD) before you submit your application to the Agency for Health Care Administration. Some properties with a well, pool, and septic tank can require extensive and costly renovations or modifications before they can be approved. Fees may be associated with plan reviews of septic systems, pools, and wells. When a group home facility with eight or more residents, has a pool, it is considered a public pool.
